Important Changes what's new for riders

Schedules for midday off-peak Morristown Line trains have been revised to accommodate trackwork between Morristown and Dover. Certain Gladstone Branch trains have also been revised to maintain connecting service at Summit and Newark Broad Street. Please review schedule panels for details.

Weekday, midday Gladstone Branch rail service has been restored. However, a separate busing program will affect Gladstone, Peapack and Far Hills customers during midday hours from August 22 through August 26. Program/schedule details will be published on njtransit.com and via station posters.

As a reminder, Gladstone Branch customers traveling to/from New York during midday hours on weekdays can save time by making their connections at Newark Broad Street. Customers who choose to transfer at Summit face waits of up to 45 minutes during midday hours on weekdays.

As a reminder, getaway service (trains shaded in green on the weekday outbound panel) will operate on Friday, September 2. Weekend/major holiday service will operate on Monday, September 5.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

Travel Information Before starting your trip, visit njtransit.com for updated service information. You can also sign up for free My Transit Alerts to receive up-to-the-minute delay information on your email, cell phone or web-enabled mobile device.

Personal Items Keep aislesways clear of obstructions at all times. Store larger items in the overhead racks or under the seats.

Pets Only service animals accompanying customers with disabilities or their trainers, police dogs and small pets in carry-on travel cages are allowed on-board NJ TRANSIT trains.

Smoking Smoking is not allowed on any trains, in any stations, or on any platforms. Violators are subject to fines.

Electronic Devices and Cell Phones Listen or speak at a volume that does not disturb other passengers.

Bicycles, Segways and In-Line Skates Collapsible bicycles are permitted aboard trains at all times. Standard-frame bicycles are permitted except on weekday trains arriving in Hoboken/New York between 6-10 a.m. or departing New York/Hoboken between 4-7 p.m. Bicyclists must board the train using a door marked with the symbol of accessibility, which in most cases are center doors requiring high-level platforms. For this reason, bicyclists should travel only to/from accessible stations, as indicated on the stick map. Bicycles are not permitted on holidays; the day prior to a holiday, Rosh Hashanah or Yom Kippur; or Friday after Thanksgiving. Conductors may make exceptions to this policy based on crowding and capacity. Limit of 2 bicycles per accessible car; customers with disabilities always have priority. There is no additional charge for bicycles. We are not responsible for bicycles that are lost, stolen or damaged on the NJ TRANSIT system. Bicycle storage is available at many stations; call 973-491-7600 for details. Our bicycle policy also applies to Segways and electric bicycles. You can carry in-line skates, but you may not wear them aboard trains.

SAFETY FIRST

Boarding or Detraining Watch the gap between the platform and train. In rain or snow, use extra caution. Always stand behind the safety line while waiting for your train. Never get on or off a moving train.

Crossing Tracks Permitted only at designated locations. Never go around the lowered gates at a grade crossing.

Please Stay Alert Many of our trains arrive noiselessly. Don't go near overhead electrified lines.

In An Emergency Listen for announcements. In case of smoke or fire, go to an adjoining car and evacuate through the nearest exit as instructed.

ON-BOARD TRAINS

Train personnel can accept cash only (no bills over \$20). A \$5 surcharge is applied if ticket vending machines (TVMs) were available or ticket offices were open at the time of boarding.



AT TICKET OFFICES/TVMS

Purchase your ticket before boarding trains when a ticket agent and/or a TVM is available. TVMs accept credit cards, debit cards and cash (no bills over \$20). If you have a personal check or Transit Benefits, please go to a ticket agent or a major terminal. NJ TRANSIT 10-trip tickets and student monthly passes are not available from TVMs. You may also purchase joint SEPTA/NJ TRANSIT tickets from TVMs for travel to/from any SEPTA regional rail station.

ONLINE

For additional convenience, you can have your monthly pass automatically delivered each month via U.S. Mail by signing up for Quik-Tik. (A non-refundable \$3 processing fee is assessed each month.) Major credit cards and transit benefits accepted. Visit njtransit.com or call 1-866-QUIK-TIK for an application.

ALSO KEEP IN MIND

Extending Your Journey If you extend your trip, you must pay the one-way fare between the destination on your ticket/pass and your final destination.

Changing Your Terminal A flat fee of \$2.75 will be charged on-board trains when you present a ticket/pass printed with Hoboken Terminal for travel to/from New York or points in New Jersey (\$4.00 from Hackettstown through Morris Plains stations, and from Basking Ridge through Gladstone stations). For travel to/from stations on the Main, Bergen County, Pascack Valley or Port Jervis lines, refer to your line's timetable for the proper change in terminal fee.

Traveling to Newark Liberty International Airport One-way tickets with the airport as the destination include an access fee of \$5.50 and are encoded to allow passage through the fare gates at the station. Please be sure to retain your ticket for use in the fare gates. Children 11 and under are not required to pay the access fee. The access fee is currently waived on monthly passes with Newark Liberty International Airport as the origin or destination. Tickets purchased aboard trains require that you pay the access fee upon arrival the airport station for fare gate passage.

Event Service

MEADOWLANDS RAIL LINE

A convenient travel option for customers via Hoboken Terminal and Secaucus Junction. Rail service operates for all major events at New Meadowlands Stadium, including all Jets & Giants home games. (Events at IZOD Center and smaller events at the stadium are served by shuttle buses to/from Secaucus Junction.) Rail service begins about 3 1/2 hours before the event and continues for about 2 hours after the event. For schedules and fares, visit njtransit.com/meadowlands.

PRUDENTIAL CENTER

NJ TRANSIT is the fast, easy way to travel to sports and entertainment events at the Prudential Center, located at the corner of Mulberry Street and Edison Place in Newark. NJ TRANSIT Bus Route Nos. 13 and 27 provide service between Newark Broad Street Station (bus stop located on Broad Street) and Prudential Center. For schedules and fares, visit njtransit.com.

Fare Options
saving you time and money

We want to make your travel convenient and economical, so we offer lots of options:

Monthly Passes Unlimited trips within a calendar month; can be purchased beginning at 5 p.m. on the 19th of the month prior and are valid until noon on the first commuting weekday of the following month.

Weekly Passes Unlimited trips from 12:01 a.m. Saturday to 6:00 a.m. on the following Saturday.

10-Trip Tickets Ten one-way trips.

One-Way Tickets One continuous trip.

One-Way Reduced Tickets One-way travel valid for senior citizens, passengers with disabilities, and children.

Senior Citizens (62 and Older) and Passengers with Disabilities can travel on-board NJ TRANSIT at a reduced fare of half the regular one-way fare or less at all times. Seniors may be asked to present valid ID (any ID or document with printed date-of-birth and issued by a government, social service or mass transportation agency). Also valid: the MTA Reduced Fare Card; PA Senior Citizen Transit ID or PACE Card; PATH Senior Fare Card; or Medicare Card. Passengers with disabilities must present an NJ TRANSIT Reduced Fare ID or Medicare Card. Call 973-378-6401 for more information.

Children's Fares Small kids, small fares: ages 5-11 save at least 50% on regular one-way fares; 4 and under (up to three children) ride free with a passenger paying any valid fare.

Family SuperSaver Fares Family-friendly NJ TRANSIT allows two children ages 5-11 to ride free with a passenger paying any valid fare from 7pm Friday (or day before a holiday) to 6am Monday (or day after a holiday).

Student Monthly Passes A good reason to stay in school. Ask a ticket agent for details.

Group Rates Planning a group trip for 10 or more? Get discounted travel. Book online at njtransit.com/grouptrips or call 973-491-7220 (leave message).

Refunds One-way and round-trip tickets are not refundable. Weekly and monthly passes and unused/partially used 10-trip tickets should be mailed to the address below. Passes mailed in after they become valid will have two full one-way fares deducted per business day. Ticket agents will issue a full cash refund for wholly unused 10-trip tickets purchased with cash. If a TVM malfunctions, it will give you an adjustment receipt. Mail it or present it to a ticket agent. If you paid cash, you'll get cash on the spot. If you don't get a receipt, report the problem to a ticket agent or the Refund Department.

Connections

NEWARK LIGHT RAIL

Service is convenient and frequent, with easy transfers from train service at Broad Street and Newark Penn stations. Take advantage of stops in downtown Newark at the NJPAC, Atlantic Street, Riverfront Stadium and Washington Park. From Newark Penn Station, frequent service is available to suburban Newark, Belleville and Bloomfield.

HUDSON BERGEN LIGHT RAIL

NJ TRANSIT riders can connect to the Hudson-Bergen Light Rail at Hoboken for trips to Bayonne, Jersey City, North Bergen, Union City and Weehawken.

SECAUCUS JUNCTION

Secaucus Junction connects 11 of NJ TRANSIT's 12 commuter rail lines. On the upper level you'll find the Northeast Corridor, North Jersey Coast Line and MidTOWN DIRECT service (on the Morris & Essex and Montclair-Boonton lines) to and from New York. On the lower level are the Main, Bergen County, Port Jervis and Pascack Valley lines. You can transfer between the upper and lower levels using magnetically encoded tickets to pass through fare gates, please be sure to retain your ticket for passage. You can transfer directly between train lines on the same level.

WE'RE ACCESSIBLE AT MANY STATIONS

Stations with the above symbol are accessible to customers using mobility assist devices. For assistance on or off the train, please inform the train crew. Customers traveling from Hoboken, please arrive 15 minutes before your scheduled train departure and notify an NJ TRANSIT representative for assistance.
